## MORE NEWARK FIRE VICTIMS.

NEWARK, N. J., March 13.—Two more bodies were recovered to-day from the ruins of the Italian tenement which was destroyed by fire at an early hour yesterday morning. They are those of Lucila Casillo, two years old, and one unidentified child about the same age. This makes sixteen in all that are known to be dead, but there are six more missing.

The two bodies were found under some hanging timbers on the second floor, and had evidently fallen from the third floor when it dropped. The finding of the bodies was a surprise, as the firemen had abandoned the place and boarded up the entrance. They were induced to make another search only because Italians in the neighborhood insisted that there must be

more bodies in the ruins.

To-night representatives of the Italian societies in this city held a meeting in Prospect Hall and took steps toward having the victims decently buried and the living who suffered by the fire cared for.

Vito Cradanza, or Cretonzo, the Italian who was arrested on suspicion of having set fire to the house, was arraigned before Judge Schalk this afternoon on suspicion of arson and remanded until to-morrow for a further hearing. If more evidence against the man is not forthcoming he may be discharged or paroled for the Grand Jury. De Prula, the chief witness against him, is still held, but Firrigino, the other witness, was paroled.
